Editorial

The Hermann Paul School of Linguistics Basel - Freiburg proudly presents its annual report 2024. It is always quite a challenge and time-consuming to compile everything that rightly deserves mention in such a report. Thus, at this point already a ton of thanks go directly to Cynthia (Dermarkar), Philipp (Dankel) our dedicated long-time coordinators in Freiburg and Basel, respectively! The outcome of the many hours of their collection, compilation and selection work, with the dedicated support of Laura Forstner, is a report which reflects what a rich and vibrant PhD ecosystem HPSL is, both in terms of taught classes and, especially, research, the latter represented, above all, by the several dozen of running, submitted or even defended PhD theses, but also by the astonishing number and thematic range of guest lectures, workshops, conferences, and other high-caliber scientific events offered to the linguistics communities in Basel and Freiburg.

In Freiburg, all regular weekly or monthly events apart (see below), special mention deserve the 13th *Italianistiktag* in March, in July the traditional Hermann Paul Lecture by Petra Schumacher (Cologne) on “The Future of Experimental Pragmatics”, immediately followed by the international ISLE Summer School on “English(es) as a Moving Target – Exploring Online Data and Online Processing” (with three course lecturers from Freiburg and 16 PhD and Master participants from Basel and Freiburg alone). The HPSL Day, an event that takes place in October and alternates between Basel and Freiburg, was hosted this time by the Freiburg doctoral students.

Basel held the closing conference for Lorenza Mondadas SNF project “First Five Words”, themed “When strangers meet in multilingual public settings: bodies, spaces and participation” in April and the closing conference for Martin Luginbühls SNF project “Levels of oral argumentation skills among school children” in November. Both projects produced two doctoral theses. Further, Basel celebrated 150 years of Indo-European studies its university by hosting the “Fachtagung der Indogermanischen Gesellschaft” in September.

An extra-special mention deserves the public exhibition “Zur Sprache kommen: Forschung zu bedrohten Sprachen sichtbar gemacht” organized by Uta Reinöhl and her team, open to the public in Freiburg University’s *Uniseum* from mid-June right until the end of August. This was simply an exemplary exercise in highly informative and awareness-raising outreach, making known to a wider university public and the city society of Freiburg what linguistics is and linguists do, especially when involved in fieldwork on endangered languages.

A significant step towards the future was the opening of the Digital Humanities Lab in Freiburg in June, (www.digitalhumanities.uni-freiburg.de), a newly established service facility providing researchers (both linguists and non-linguists) with state-of-the-art hardware, software, and methodological advice. The lab will be a central facility for the linguistic research training and thus offers HPSL doctoral students an attractive additional research infrastructure, including appropriate methodological advice in the context of workshops and the preparation of third-party funding applications.

2024 was a year of great achievements for our current generation of doctoral students. A total of nine PhD candidates were able to defend their dissertations (three in Freiburg, six in Basel), and ten more submitted their work by the end of the year (seven in Freiburg, three in Basel). The HPSL is therefore in a state of transition. A new generation of doctoral students is currently

taking their first steps, like Eleonora Kael and her project “Acknowledging the Human-Animal Bond – Creating Trust and Providing Expertise in Veterinarian-Client-Health Discourse”, who won the 2024 Hermann Paul Scholarship. And with new research projects that just started (e.g. the SNF Advanced Grant “Intersensoriality: Achieving the intelligibility of multimodal resources in and for social interaction”) or are in the starting blocks for 2025 (e.g. or the Leibniz Kooperative Exzellenz: “Gender in Sprache – Wirtschaft – Kognition”) new bright minds will start their dissertations in 2025.

On a final and more personal note, the following should not go unnoticed. In December 2024 the generation change in the HPSL board of the Freiburg branch was completed: Alice Blumenthal-Dramé (English Department) replaced Bernd Kortmann, who had been a member of the board since 2017 and guided the development of our graduate school with care and foresight. Our heartfelt thanks for your dedicated work, especially in these times of financial and personnel shortages, dear Bernd! But there is a second farewell to the board which the readers of this Annual Report by all means need to be alerted to: Stefan Pfänder (Romance Department), the very Mr HPSL, founding member and long-time Speaker and *spiritus rector* of the School at the Freiburg end, left the board after many years of dedicated service and creating top-quality conditions and facilities for PhD training in (especially empirical) linguistics. Dear Stefan, speaking for and from the heart of all linguistics colleagues and many generations of doctoral students ever since HPSL was founded, the School would not have become what it is without your continuous intellectual and social input, your guidance, far-sightedness and, not least, apparently endless energy ... and patience! Thank you so much for everything you have done for creating an exemplary environment for the next generations of linguists!

The new quartet of directors in Freiburg, consisting of Alice Blumenthal-Dramé, Daniela Marzo, Simon Pröll and, as PhD representative, Isolde Bonnet, is committed to continuing to run the school in this spirit of the highest academic standards. All the best to the new team!

Last but not least, we are extremely pleased that our successful collaboration has been put on a formal footing in 2024. The HPSL cooperation agreement between the University of Freiburg and the University of Basel was finalized and signed by both rectorates in this year. This further consolidates our long-term and exemplary cooperation and provides a strong foundation for the upcoming generational change at professorial level, which will take place in both Freiburg and Basel over the next few years.

Obituaries

In 2024, the University of Freiburg was saddened by the deaths of three of its leading linguists, Prof. Dr. Hans Martin Gauger, Prof. Dr. Wolfgang Raible and Prof. Dr. Thomas Städtler. We would like to take this opportunity to pay tribute to them, as they have laid the foundations for many of the current research topics and projects here in Freiburg and Basel.

In memoriam Wolfgang Raible (* 1 March 1939 † 2 September 2024)

Wolfgang Raible studied Classical Philology, Philosophy, and Romance Studies in Kiel, Innsbruck, Poitiers, and Salamanca, earning his doctorate in 1965 in Kiel with a thesis on spatial concepts in Aristotelian physics. After habilitating in 1971 on the topic *Sentence and Text: Studies in Four Romance Languages*, he contributed to the founding of Bielefeld University's Faculty of Linguistics before holding professorships at Siegen and Freiburg, where he remained Chair of Romance Philology (French and Italian Linguistics) from 1978 until his retirement in 2007.

Raible's research was deeply theoretical and consistently interdisciplinary. A pioneer of text linguistics in the 1960s and 70s, and an early advocate for bringing language typology and universals into Romance philology, he later integrated linguistics, media studies, cultural studies, and neuroscience. Also, he turned his attention to creole genesis in multilingual, colonial settings.

Wolfgang Raible played a formative role in advancing both linguistics and Romance studies in Germany. He was the driving force behind the DFG Collaborative Research Centre 321, *Transitions and Tensions between Orality and Literacy*, which ran from 1985 to 1996. The centre shaped the humanities at Freiburg University in lasting ways and was influential well beyond philology into the broader humanities and social sciences.

In 1986, Raible was elected a full member of the Heidelberg Academy of Sciences. He also served in many national scientific bodies, including the DFG, the Wissenschaftsrat, and the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation. His scholarly achievements earned him numerous accolades including the Research Prize of the State of Baden-Württemberg (1990), the Gottfried Wilhelm Leibniz Prize of the DFG (1992), and the Heisenberg Medal of the Humboldt Foundation (2002).

Above all, Wolfgang Raible cared deeply for his academic students. He supervised 39 doctoral theses and 14 habilitations—half of them by women—all of whom went on to become professors. Many others, though not formally his students, also benefited from his generous support.

The Hermann Paul School of Linguistics honours his memory with lasting gratitude.

Stefan Pfänder, Daniel Jacob, and Bernd Kortmann (Freiburg); Maria Selig (Regensburg)

In memoriam Hans-Martin-Gauger (* 19 June 1935 † 26 June 2024)

After studying Romance languages and literature, English, German and philosophy in Tübingen, Leicester, Santander and Paris, Hans-Martin Gauger received his doctorate under Mario Wandruszka in Tübingen in 1961 and went on to complete his habilitation there in 1968. Drawing on the structural linguistic approaches of his theses and the monumental *Contrastive Grammar of Spanish-German*, Hans-Martin Gauger took a broad approach characterised by a comprehensive knowledge of French and Spanish culture, the ›Bildungskanon‹ and literature.

His *Introduction to Romance Linguistics*, co-written with Wulf Oesterreicher and Rudolf Windisch, was a milestone for Romance studies, addressing fundamental questions of language theory on the basis of a profound history of the discipline.

The approach he advocated of a "bewusstseins-eigenen Sprachwissenschaft" ('linguistics rooted in consciousness') was also referred to as *cognitive linguistics ante litteram*. He also explored stylistic issues and language criticism, topics with which he was also present in the non-academic public sphere, in major daily newspapers and on the radio.

Among countless other honours, Hans-Martin Gauger was the recipient of the *Karl-Vossler-Preis* for 'scholarly works of literary standard' and the *Deutscher Sprachpreis*. He was a member (and from 1984 to 1989 Vice President) of the *German Academy for Language and Literature*, a member of the *Bavarian Academy of Fine Arts*; he was a Fellow of the *Wissenschaftskolleg zu Berlin* and the *Siemens-Stiftung* in Munich. His membership (as a corresponding member) of the *Austrian Academy of Sciences* and the *Real Academia Española* reflected his international reputation.

Finally, numerous students of Hans-Martin Gauger, now professors themselves, have shaped an entire generation of Romance studies research and teaching. In particular, the weekly *Linguistic Colloquium*, jointly organised by Hans-Martin Gauger and Wolfgang Raible, was a popular platform for young linguists beyond the field of Romance studies in Freiburg and proved to be an important talent pool.

The Faculty of Philology, the Department of Romance Studies, the Hermann Paul Center and the Hermann Paul School of Linguistics will honour his memory with gratitude.

Daniel Jacob (Freiburg)

In memoriam Thomas Städtler (* 26 June 1957 † 3 June 2024)

After studying Romance languages and literature and sociology in Augsburg, Heidelberg and Barcelona, Thomas Städtler completed a doctorate in Heidelberg with a thesis on the writing of grammar (“Grammatikographie”) in the French Middle Ages. He was recruited as a research assistant for the *Dictionnaire étymologique de l'ancien français (DEAF)*, has worked as an editor since 1983 and as the head of the project since 2007. As one of the major long-term lexicographical projects of the Heidelberg Academy of Sciences, the DEAF seemed an eternal undertaking; it was Thomas Städtler and his colleagues who brought the time perspective down to a human scale, notably by means of consistent digitization.

Thomas Städtler was an expert on medieval French texts and one of the most renowned researchers in the fields of historical linguistics, text editing and historical lexicography in the German and French-speaking world. Few German Romance scholars were as well-known and well-connected in France as he was, with particularly close ties to the centre for corpus-based lexicography and linguistics of French, the University of Nancy 2, and the highly renowned ATILF Laboratory (*Analyse et traitement informatique de la langue française*) based there, with its major projects FRANTEXT and *Tresor de la langue française*. He also acquired his “Habilitation à diriger des recherches” there. Through a transfer of habilitation to the University of Freiburg, he was appointed *Privatdozent* in 2008 and adjunct professor at our university from 2013 until his retirement in 2023.

His colleagues and students vividly remember his charisma and the didactic talent with which he inspired many students to take an interest in the world of Old French texts. He greatly enriched the University of Freiburg's Linguistics and Romance Studies Department as a person and as a colleague. We will sadly miss him!

10.1 HPSL Day 2024 in Freiburg

This year’s HPSL Day, hosted by the University of Freiburg, took place on October 25th, 2024, at the Haus zur Lieben Hand in Freiburg. 10.2 Hermann Paul Lecture

The Hermann Paul Lecture is traditionally hosted by the Hermann-Paul-Centrum für Linguistik in Freiburg. This year it took place at the Haus zur Lieben Hand and was followed by a reception.

11 July: Prof. Dr. Petra Schumacher (Universität zu Köln): The Future of Experimental Pragmatics

Abstract: The last decades have seen an upsurge of research into experimental pragmatics, i.e. the study of how interlocutors use language and how speaker's meaning is processed. However, in spite of the fact that the target of research within experimental pragmatics is speaker-hearer interaction, including among others the identification of speaker's intentions, the degree of informativity and addressee's tolerance, we have mainly relied on highly controlled, lab-based experiments. Yet, ecological validity seems to be crucial when investigating language use in interaction. In my talk, I will assess these past practices employed in the psycho- and neurolinguistic research and show that the time is ripe to move towards more naturalistic, less controlled settings. Such settings range from the presentation of audio book recordings to natural communicative situations.
